the financial autism impact of autism

According to the Centers for Disease Control, Autism is one of the fastest growing developmental disorders in the U.S., affecting 1 in 68 children. Treatment and services are typically not covered by insurance causing an out of pocket annual expense of \$60,000 for most families.

Allied Services Wilkes-Barre Rehab Hospital provides therapy to any child with autism, regardless of the family's ability to pay. An average 13-week speech therapy session costs approximately \$4,000. This year's proceeds will help to defray the cost of such services. None of the money raised will be used for salaries.

Major Sponsor Augmentative Communication Computer can be used as part of occupational therapy programs to assist children with an alternative method to written communication.

Feature Sponsor The JCC Camp Scholarship in memory of Susan Yelen provides access to socialization experiences for pediatric patients whose families cannot afford the camp.

Friend of Tournament Oral and Tactile Sensory Tools for 40 children with Autism: In-home carry over can be very costly for families. An inventory of oral motor chewy tubes and sensory brushes would provide necessary tools for home programs at no cost to the families.
